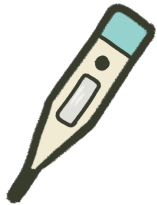

The unit has a high acuity of patients along with a high turnover of patients. It has often been said the 7.3 is the busiest unit in the province with admissions and discharges in a day.

UNIT DESCRIPTION

RCVICU provides exemplary, compassionate tertiary and quaternary care to the post-operative open-heart patient population. CVICU is specifically designed to provide appropriate assessment, evaluation, and treatment of post-operative open-heart patients, while fostering an environment of professional growth, teamwork, and family centered care. Surgeries include coronary artery bypass graft (CABG), valve replacement/repair, adult congenital surgeries, thoracic aneurysm repair, medical and or surgical repair of aortic dissections, heart transplant, major vessel chest trauma, TAVI, ventricular assist device (VAD) program and VA ECMO program. The mandate within this service and unit is to provide holistic, high quality clinical care, characterized by an advanced level of knowledge and technical skills based on advances in research and practice in a multidisciplinary environment.

UNIT ORIENTATION

Registered Nurse (RN) unit specific orientation is comprehensive and individualized based on one's experience, qualifications, and formal training. As an example, an RN with previous, recent critical care experience and or Critical Care Course would receive 10-12 orientation shifts in addition to organizational onboarding and dedicated time with the Clinical Nurse Educator (CNE). More specific training in advanced competencies, such as Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy (CRRT), IABP, ECMO and VAD is individualized in collaboration with the employee, CNE and Clinical Lead as part of career progression planning, again based on experience(s) and professional milestones in the first year.

The RN contributes to the efficient and effective functioning of the unit, coordination of patient care and staffing. Participation on committees such as the CVICU Professional Practice that support continuous quality activities. The RN accepts responsibility for maintaining and continually enhancing competencies through ongoing professional development including participation in education programs and research.

SCHEDULING

Self-Scheduling: 12 hour shifts, 24 hours per day, 7 days per week

SKILLS REQUIRED

Advanced assessment, critical thinking, and decision-making skills. Strong interpersonal and communication skills, as well as organizational and teaching skills. Certification for care of patients requiring invasive and non-invasive mechanical ventilation and advanced hemodynamic monitoring. Administration of complex medications, including but not limited to vasopressors and inotropic agents, anti-arrhythmics, anticoagulants, paralytics, conscious and unconscious sedation, fluid resuscitation and administration of blood products using both massive and rapid transfusion protocols. Knowledge of ACLS protocols and IV push medications and ability to acquire skills and knowledge in more advanced critical life support systems including ECMO, CRRT, VAD and IABP. This advanced competency training will be provided once foundational ICU experience is acquired.

4.1 ORTHOPEDICS/IMCU

Service Orthopedic Trauma

UNIT DESCRIPTION

4.1/IMCU is an Orthopedic Trauma unit that provides care to patients with acute ortho injuries requiring surgical and medical management. The unit cares for patients with fractures, polytrauma, post-operative ortho procedures, and complex trauma-related conditions. The unit consists of 32 inpatient beds and a 4-bed Intermediate Care Unit (IMCU) that manages higher-acuity orthopedic trauma patients requiring closer monitoring.

RESPONSIBILITIES

UNIT ORIENTATION

New staff complete a minimum of 12 orientation shifts paired with an RN preceptor. Progress during orientation is assessed at the halfway point (touchpoints with CNE)—with additional orientation shifts provided as needed to support safe and independent practice.

LICENSE/CERTIFICATION AND EDUCATION REQUIRED

- Registered Nurses: Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) or equivalent and current registration with the College of Registered Nurses of Nova Scotia

UNIT DESCRIPTION

3IMCU is a 12-bed Intermediate Care Unit, caring for a wide range of medical diagnosis. Interventions and treatment unique to 3IMCU include: Mechanical ventilation, acute BiPAP/CPAP, Allergy Desensitization, bedside GI scopes, Bronchoscopy and Continuous IV titration medications. Staff work within a multidisciplinary team to deliver specialized care.

UNIT ORIENTATION

New Nursing Graduate Orientation: One eight hour day of general hospital orientation followed by 5 med/surg module. This is provided by Professional Practice. The Graduate Nurse then has 10-12/ 12 hours shifts paired with a preceptor. In addition, there is an 8 hour education day with our Clinical Nurse Educator to orientate staff to the unit and an 11.25 hr cardiac rhythm course. Experienced Orientation: This could be less or more based on experience. If the experienced nurse is external he/she would attend the hospital orientation. All staff would be required to complete the cardiac rhythm course following orientation for the care of the patient on telemetry.

UNIT DESCRIPTION

6.2 is a 41 patient Cardiology unit with capacity of 39 telemetry beds. Patients are received in transfer from the inpatient CCU/IMCU/ER. Provides tertiary care for all of Nova Scotia, Cape Breton and PEI

The Neurology, Stroke and Epilepsy Monitoring Unit consist of 30 acute inpatient beds dedicated to the Neurology and Stroke service and a 4-bed epilepsy monitoring unit (EMU).

It is a specialized medicine unit with:

- A primary focus of providing neurology and stroke services. The focus of care includes acute stabilization/assessment for newly diagnosed stroke/neurology patients, intermediate stroke/neurology rehabilitation care, and managing patients with complex needs from both a care planning and/or discharge perspective.
- There is always an RN role in acute and sub-acute care based on the requirements of establishing the nursing plan of care inclusive of discharge planning. The requirements for the frequency and intensity of RN to complete these functions are influenced by many factors including acuity and complexity of patient needs, patient length of stay/turnover, the existence of care pathways, and other members of the inter-professional team who can either contribute and/or take the lead role in meeting the patient care need.
- LPN scope of practice can be efficiently optimized when a patient's plan of care is established, there is a predictable trajectory for anticipated care needs, patient response to the treatment plan can be anticipated and there is the appropriate volume of patients can meet these criteria.

- The EMU (4 specialized beds): would be only assigned to the unit- staff due to special training requirements.
